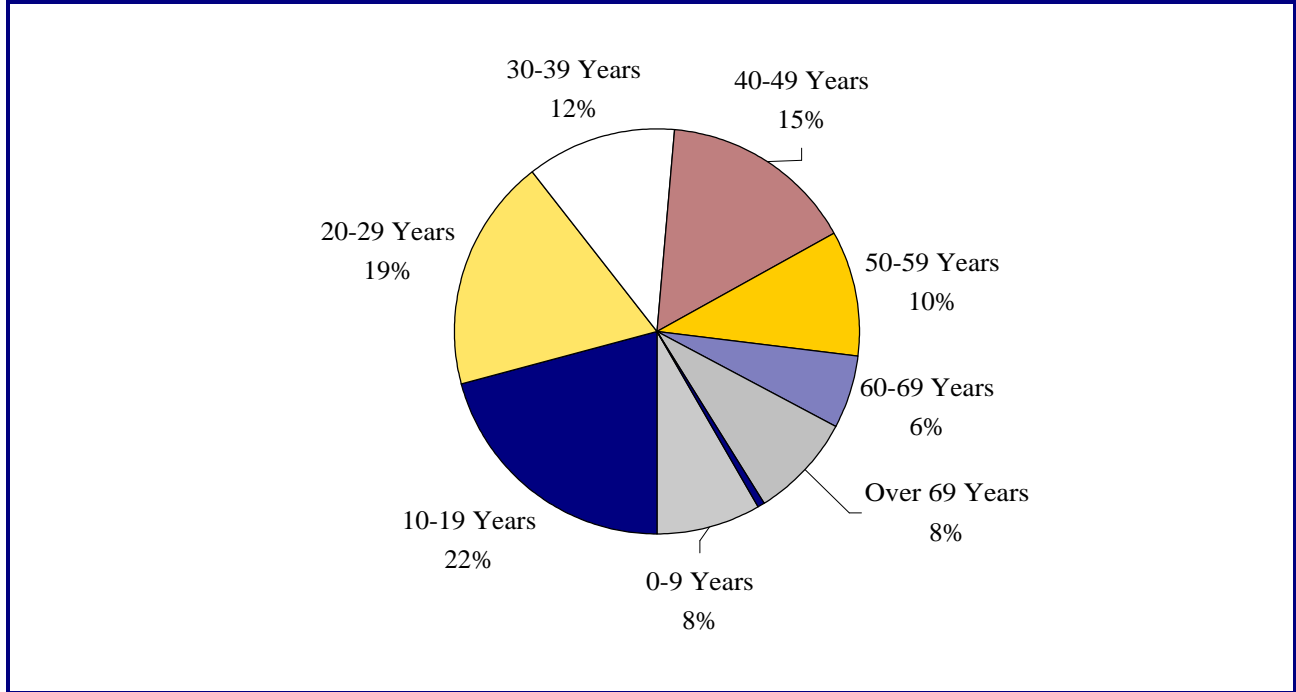

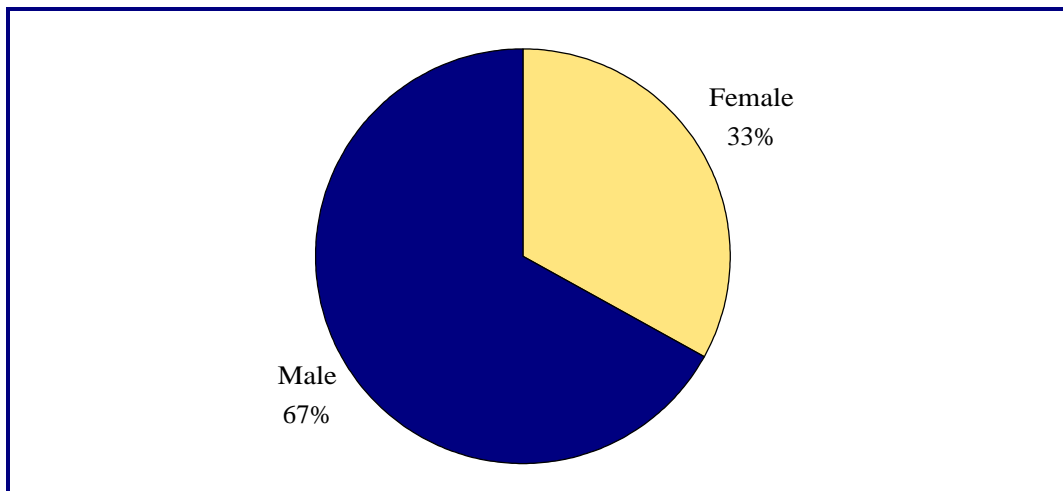
Figure 2.1: Trauma Care Patients by Age Group, SFY 2004

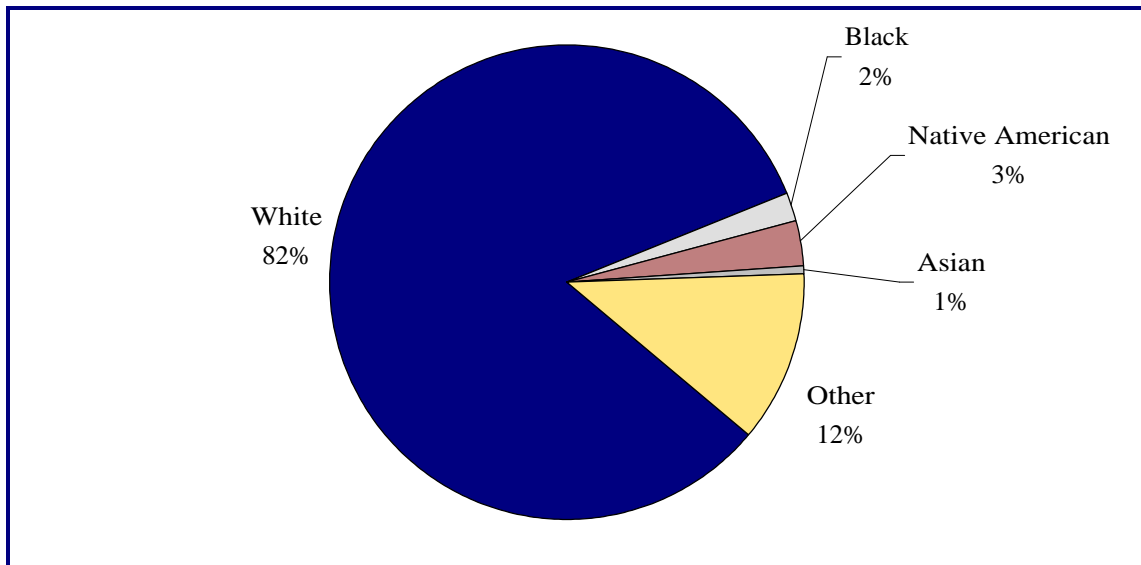
Figure 2.2: Trauma Care Patients by Gender, SFY 2004

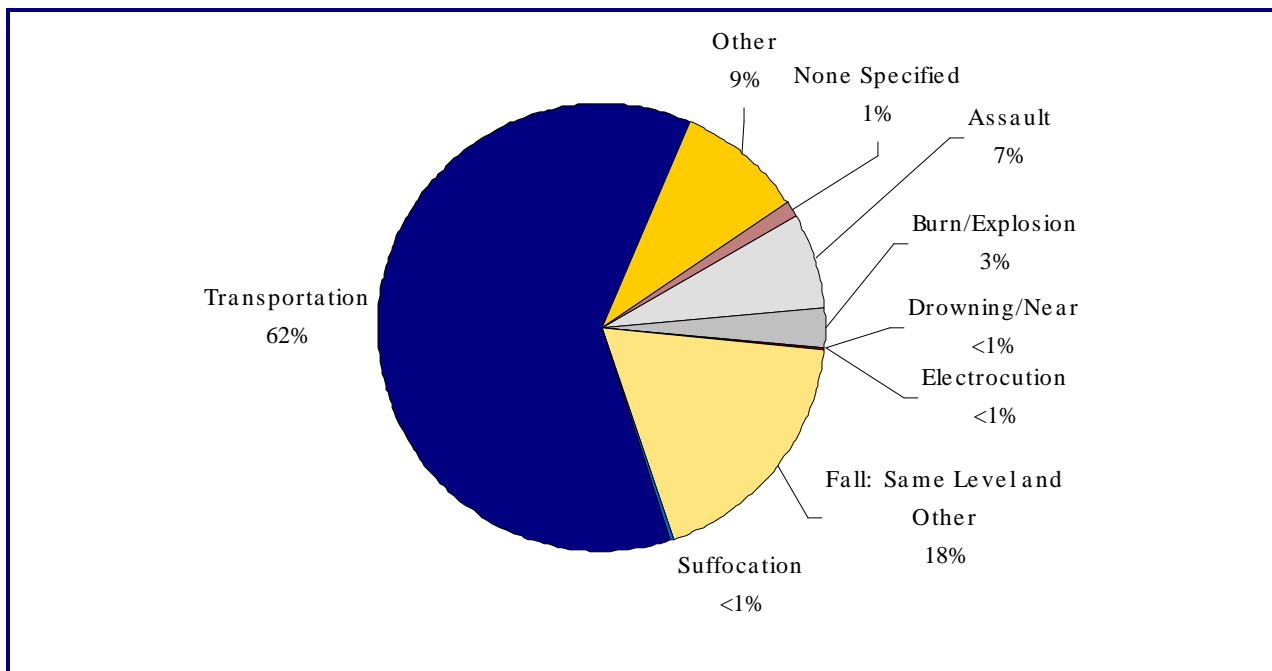

Figure 2.3: Trauma Care Patients by Race, SFY 2004



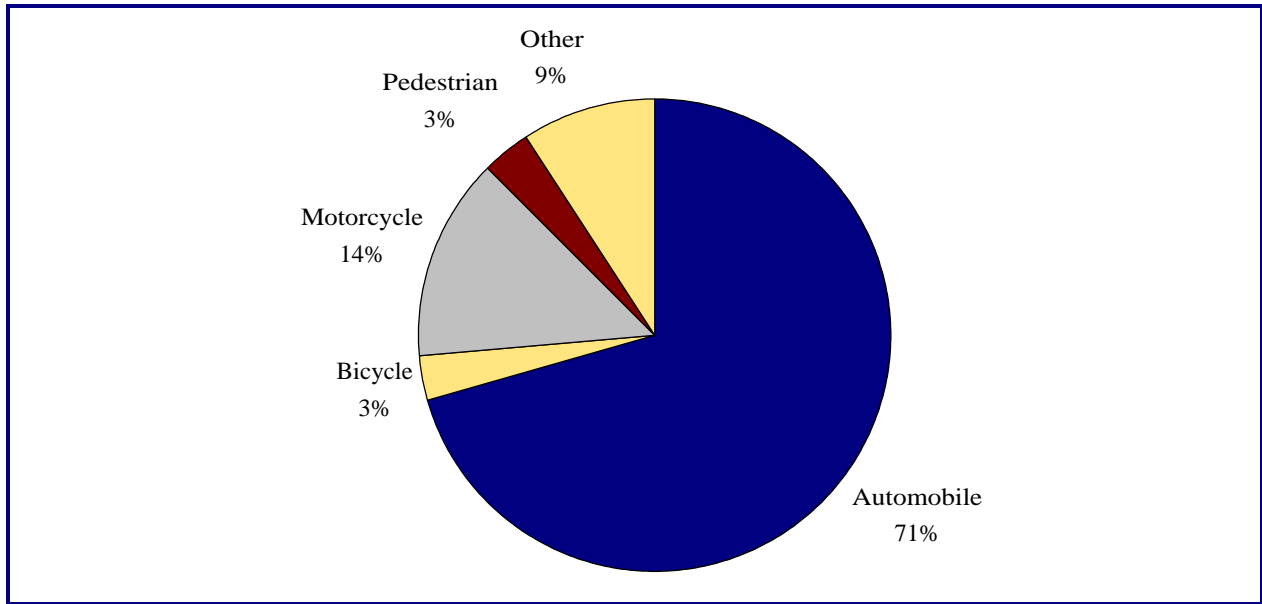

Figure 2.4: Traumatic Event Type, SFY 2004



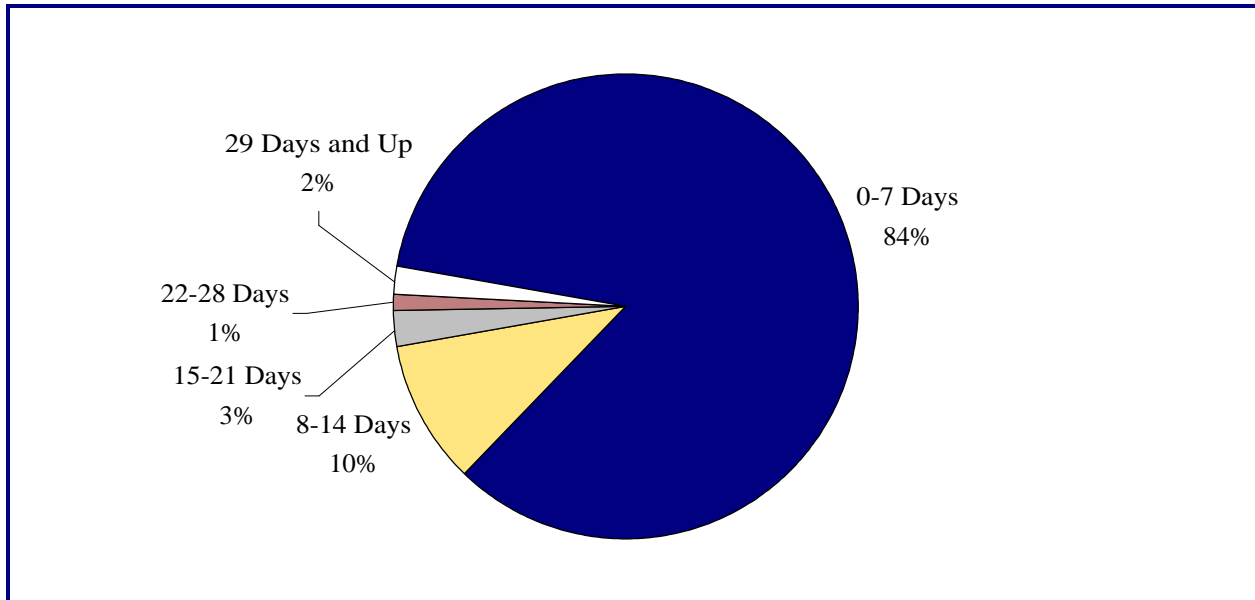

Figure 2.5: Trauma Care Incidence by Transportation Type



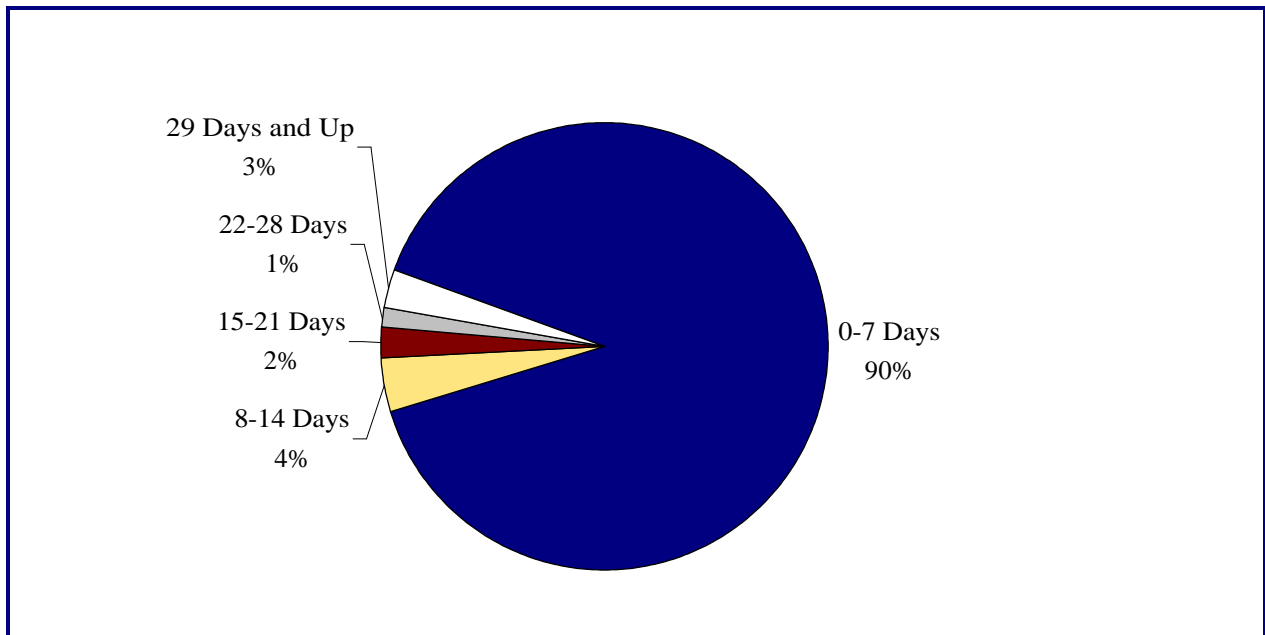
